# From the Rectory Study

On behalf of Kim, Timothy, Hannah, and myself, I would like to wish you a peaceful New Year. It is hard to believe that we are in January once again and it is even more difficult to believe that the COVID-19 pandemic remains the dominant theme of our news headlines. All of us are still directly impacted by this virus. Recent announcements from the Northern Ireland Executive have indicated that we are entering a new season of lockdown. The various regulations are stringent, but they are necessary as we seek to see a notable decrease in the transmission of coronavirus.

The past year has been a tremendous challenge for all of us. I know, from speaking to many of you, that you have greatly missed being able to gather with each other – for worship on Sundays, a cup of tea/coffee afterwards, and as part of the many parochial organisations. The sense of togetherness and community which exists at the very heart of Mossley Parish has been greatly impacted by the covid restrictions and guidelines. We all long for the day when we can meet together, without limitation, and enjoy engaging in the activities that we love and growing together as a community of faith once again.

In the days between Christmas and the New Year, I spent some time reflecting on the journey that we have all been on since March 2020. It really has been a challenge. Yet through it all God has remained close to us. Despite the physical restrictions which are in place, we can still experience the comfort of God's peace and presence. We can spend increased periods of time in prayer, reading His Word, or listening to our music. God cares deeply about us and He is there for us during these difficult and uncertain times. Once more, I find myself focusing quite profoundly on a verse from the New Testament. Personally, I find these eleven words to be challenging and comforting. They challenge me to set aside time each day to spend specifically with God. In the first Sunday in January, during the Morning Service, I mentioned that I like to use the Bible In One Year study programme which has been created by Nicky Gumbel (Vicar of Holy Trinity Brompton) and I do commend it to you. These words also comfort me because they remind me that God is there for each of us. Even during this next phase of lockdown, God longs to draw alongside us and He offers each of us His peace.

May we reach out to Him during these coming days and weeks.

Dear Friends,

By now most of you will be aware that the Executive has met with church leaders and, in keeping with the current lockdown, in-church worship will be suspended at this current time. We are thankful that we have been able to meet faithfully most Sunday mornings since 19<sup>th</sup> July and we would also like to express our sincere thanks to everyone who has ensured that this has been possible.

For the time being we will continue to offer online worship each Sunday morning. The services for each week, all of which are outlined on the previous page, will be available on YouTube, Facebook, the Dial-In Facility (02893270073), and our website (www.mossley.org) We will continue to offer Coffee Time Challenges each Monday morning, with the answers being made available on Fridays, and Bible Studies each Tuesday evening. Details regarding our new Bible Study series are available on Page 6. During the season of Lent, we will be releasing short and reflective services each Wednesday evening at 7pm, commencing on Ash Wednesday. A full list of worship services with accompanying Bible readings can be found on the next page of this magazine.

The guidance which we have received indicates that weddings and funerals can proceed but with limited numbers of people in attendance and in adherence to all the current Covid-19 guidelines.

Parish visitation has also been suspended. This is a protective action which seeks to safeguard the health of clergy and parishioners. As an alternative, the Rector, Rev Louise and other members of the parish will be in contact via telephone.

Practical help (e.g. picking up prescriptions or shopping) is available. A team of volunteers, to help with such practicalities, has been assembled. If you could benefit from such practical help, please contact the Rector or Rev Louise.

Once more, let us continue to encourage and support one another through phone calls, text messages and other creative ways. Please stay in touch. Let us also continue to trust in the sovereignty of God at this time.

# Update from the South American Mission Society

Since the last edition of our magazine, the Rector has continued to stay connected with SAMS Ireland. Two main developments have taken place.

## Perú

Bishop Jorge reached out to SAMS Ireland for some help in providing practical support for Peruvian families in the days leading up to Christmas. His proposal was called 'Jesus is



Christmas' and it involved providing food hampers for 100 families who were struggling at Christmas. Each hamper would contain basic groceries, rice, sugar, milk, fish, butter, jam, sweetbread, and chocolate. The cost of this project was projected to be £2000.

In early December, we were able to send £2000 from Mossley Parish (money which had been raised for mission work and was held in the Mossley Mission Account) and cover the cost of this wonderful project. It is so encouraging to think that, as a Parish, we have directly helped 100 families this Christmas.

## Mexico

In early December the Rector, along with the Mission Director and a further member of the SAMS Ireland Council, took part in a Zoom call with Joel Gonzalez. Joel is married to Mayra and they have a baby boy called Joel Fernandois. Joel is seeking to establish several new Anglican churches in Mexico and was reaching out to SAMS for prayerful and practical support.

It was encouraging to hear how passionate Joel is about this venture. He reminded us that Britain fits eight times into Mexico! His state, Puebla, has a population of six million people. This is, undoubtedly, an exciting project and it is certainly ambitious. Pictured (right) is Dylan, Rebeca, and baby Asher. This family has partnered with Joel and his family as they seek to progress with the vision that God has given them of planting churches in Mexico.

#### Your £2,000 Donation For the benefit of the work of Tansen Mission Hospital in Nepal

I am writing to you on behalf of Tansen Hospital to thank the Church and its Mission Group for the continuing support of Tansen Hospital with a donation of £2,000.

As you are probably aware United Mission to Nepal had identified that the effects of the COVID pandemic would result in the hospitals having an estimated shortfall in the first year of \$1.4m USD and launched a Save Our Hospitals campaign. To date the Appeal has reached raised more than half of the expected annual shortfall with more promised. Although the giving has slowed it is encouraging that significant amounts are continuing to be received.

Whilst there is good news about the vaccine development, COVID-19 will not be eradicated quickly. Even when it has been, the effects on Nepal and its economy will last a long time and this is especially so for those already suffering from poverty in its many forms.

The work of UMN and its hospitals has become heavier at a time when its usual main financial supporting partners will have many calls on their limited resources. Also, about 80% of the hospital income is from charging for medical treatment, and the earnings of those in the hospital's catchment area will take a long time to recover. This will result in many families having less money for medical treatment and in some cases, less funds for quality or even for sufficient food.

Recently we have learnt of further concerns relating to the hospital at Tansen. The following is an extract from the UMN Executives Director's weekly prayer pointers.

- Currently in Tansen Mission Hospital 10-16 ill patients are being cared for in our isolation ward each day. The hospital is short staffed as some staff are in isolation, having contracted COVID19 and others are off caring for sick relatives.
- Also please pray that expats' visas and work permits will be processed soon. If these are not processed
  we will be in a position where expat doctors and others cannot work.

Please remember us from time to time in your personal, group or church prayer times, praying for strength and protection for the workers and for adequate on-going financial provision.
