From the Rectory Study

In the latter years of the Twentieth Century the President Harry S. Truman library in Missouri published 1,300 letters that the late President wrote to his wife, Bess, over the course of fifty years. Mr Truman had a lifelong rule of writing to his wife every day they were apart. He followed this rule whenever he was away on official business or whenever Bess left Washington to return home to Missouri. Various scholars consistently examined these letters for any new light that they may have thrown on political and diplomatic history.

Even though these letters were written by a former President of USA, one of the most impressive revelations from these letters was simply that every day he was away, Harry Truman took time to step aside from dealing with the world's most powerful leaders to sit down and write a letter to his wife. What was clear from these letters was the incredible love that existed between Harry and Bess Truman.

Whether we often admit it or not, we all like to be loved. Mother Theresa of Calcutta once suggested that each of us has an insatiable hunger to be genuinely loved. She said, "The hunger for love is much more difficult to remove than the hunger for bread." The past year and the global COVID-19 pandemic have made this abundantly clear. We have all missed being able to meet up with our loved ones - our families and friends - and we are looking forward to restrictions being eased and a greater sense of normality being restored.

During the past year we have been consistently reflecting on, and holding tight to, the unconditional love that God has for each of us. In the Bible the word 'agape' is used to describe God's love. There are no parameters to this Godly love. There are no limits, no conditions, no barriers. Put simply, we were made by God to be loved by God and (in turn) to love God. No matter who we are, what we have done, or what we are going through right now, God cares for us and God loves us. The One who made the universe cares deeply about each of us – he knows us by name, we are precious to him. Isaiah 43 begins with some remarkable words which highlight this personal nature of God – "But now, this is what the LORD says - he who created you, Jacob, he who formed you, Israel: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine."

I never cease to be amazed by the reality that we are deeply loved by God. He is always there for us and we can turn to him at anytime and anywhere. As we approach the summer months, may we take time to pray and to read the Scriptures, to spend time alone with God. In doing so it is my prayer that we would, once more, experience the unconditional love that God has for each of us.

We were absolutely delighted to be able to reopen for in-church worship on Good Friday, 2nd April. It was encouraging to see our Easter services so well attended. As ever, all the usual precautions and mitigations remain in place for in-church worship, and we thank you for your help in ensuring that these are adhered to. We would like to thank each person who helps in any way to ensure that we can meet safely on Sunday mornings. It warms our hearts to see you, the parishioners of Mossley, in our church building as we seek to worship God together. If you would like to attend either of our Sunday morning in-church services, please contact either Mrs Winifred Clarke (07749064808) or Mr John Nesbitt (07954150067).

We are delighted to announce that our midweek services of Holy Communion, at 10am on Wednesday mornings, will recommence on Wednesday 5th May. At this stage, prebooking will not be required for this service but all the other COVID guidelines will remain in place. For example, social distancing will still apply, contact tracing forms must be completed, and the wearing of face masks is strongly encouraged.

Some parishioners may still feel more comfortable engaging with online worship at this time. As such, we will continue to upload worship services each Sunday morning. The services for each week, all of which are outlined on the next page, will be available on YouTube, Facebook, the Dial-In Facility (02893270073), and our website (www.mossley.org). We will continue to offer Coffee Time Challenges each Monday morning and Bible Studies each Tuesday evening. As was previously the case, weddings and funerals can proceed but with limited numbers of people in attendance and in adherence to all the current Covid-19 guidelines.

It is hoped that a phased reopening of the Parish Centre can take place soon — in keeping with the framework which was released by the Northern Ireland Executive. Further details about this will be released in due course.

Once more, we would like to thank you for your ongoing support of our Parish, and we look forward to being able to see you all in person again as soon as possible. Until then, let us continue to unite in prayer and seek the guidance and peace of God.





One Hundred Years of the Royal British Legion

One hundred years ago, on 15th May 1921, the British Legion was founded in the aftermath of the First World War, to provide support to veterans of the British Armed Forces, their families and dependants.

It was created at a time when two million people were unemployed. More than six million had served in the war. Of those who came back, 1.75 million had

suffered some kind of injury, and half of those were disabled permanently.




At first membership of the Legion was confined to ex-Service personnel, but it was expanded to include serving members of the Forces in 1981.

What Did I Do With The Car?

As I left a meeting at our church, I could not find my car keys. They were not in my pockets. They were not in the church. Then I thought — I've left them in the car! As I burst through the doors of the church, my heart sank: the church car park was empty. With a heavy heart I called the police, confessed that I had left my keys in the car, and that it had been stolen. Then I made the really difficult call and told my wife that the car had



been stolen. There was a little gasp. "You did not have the car. I dropped you off. Remember?"

My heart sang as relief flooded through me. "Of course! Thank God! Well, come get me quick – I am already running late... what is keeping you?"

My wife replied with ominous calm: "What's keeping me? I'll tell you what's keeping me. The police are here. They think I've stolen the car..."

Update from Tansen

We are delighted to have received the following update from Tansen Hospital. Dr Karrach has thanked us for our continued support of Tansen and has asked us to continue to remember Tansen Hospital in our prayers.



Last year was a strange year as it was everywhere. Nepal's first wave of COVID really got going over the autumn. We were under strict lockdown for a few months from late March until July and then the number of cases rose, mostly fuelled by migrant workers returning from India and then by many people travelling to their home villages for the big festivals in October/ November.

The hospital continued to provide uninterrupted care despite the COVID-19 pandemic. In November COVID care was transferred to the medical ward as the numbers were increasing and the provincial COVID hospital was overwhelmed. We handed back the old people's home which we had used as a quarantine facility in mid-January. In total 128 patients have received Hospital Isolation care. The total COVID confirmed cases in hospital care is 45 (includes surgery and delivery cases) and the total number of COVID deaths total 8. We have had 43 staff infected (no fatalities, 8 were admitted mostly for social reasons). The medical ward returned to being a medical ward in March and isolation patients were shifted back to the 3 rooms used at the beginning of the pandemic. The hospital was made a vaccination centre and we conducted 3 phases for the vaccination of government defined groups. We also struggled with balancing demand, safety and staffing levels as travel restrictions eased and many more outpatients arrived. All statistics were down except maternity numbers and emergency surgery which stayed high and continues to be higher than previous years. However, numbers started picking up during the past few weeks.

The hospital continued to participate in the national health insurance scheme. This was popular with patients and ensured patient flow continued even under lockdown, but with 80% of patients now coming under this scheme there had been increased loss of expected income as the amounts reimbursed are often lower than our costs.

We are now facing a second wave of COVID and patients are testing positive again. Looking at the situation in India, which is our near neighbour, this may be much worse than the first wave, so we are beginning to brace ourselves.

We have received the following updates from South America and there are several key issues to pray for at this time.

Isaiah Project

SAMS Ireland has a COVID-19 response fund called Isaiah Project. Through this we have been able to make contributions to the Dioceses of Peru, Uruguay and Northern Argentina. Please pray for the different partner organisations as they use some of these funds to help individuals negotiate their way through the difficulties of the pandemic.



The Hawksbees (Paraguay)

Chris and Alison Hawksbee would appreciate ongoing prayer for them as they have recently contracted COVID-19. Recent news would indicate that their condition has been stable. Please pray for them as they live with the present symptoms and journey to a full recovery.

Alec Deane

Alec Deane continues to work with Siwok Foundation as they bring fresh water and horticultural expertise to Wichi Indian communities in the Chaco region of Northern Argentina. Pray for him and his team of helpers. Pray particularly for his contacts with government agencies as he represents the plight of the Wichi people.

Paraguay

We pray for Pastor Agustin and his wife Teresa as they oversee the work of the diocese in the absence of a bishop. Please pray for strength and wisdom for them and also for health and safety as they travel extensively.

We pray for the church in Concepcion as it is without a main leader, asking that God will protect and build up the church and those who lead within it, giving them wisdom and grace and that He will provide a pastor. We give thanks for the pastors from Asunción who will be visiting regularly and pray that these visits will be a mutual blessing.

As there is currently no-one living on site please pray too for protection from thieves or vandals.

Schools in Paraguay are restarting again after a year of not being present in schools. Cases of COVID-19 are already high, and this causes concern as students return to class. Please pray for the teachers and students as they start back.
