Prayer Fellowship

'In the morning, Lord, you hear my voice; In the morning I lay my requests before you and wait expectantly.' (Psalm 5:3)

We all know that our first thoughts and habits upon waking each morning have an enormous effect on our attitude and mood for the rest of the day. It's natural to begin planning and worrying about everything we are about to face. Instead, why not take a little time to talk to God first? When we make our first thoughts about our heavenly Father, we are welcoming His peace, protection and guidance into everything we plan to do.



It's good to begin our prayers by expressing our gratitude for all our heavenly Father's many, many gifts and goodness to us - not least the gift of a new day! Even during challenging times there are always things we can be thankful for. God delights in us when we maintain hearts full of gratitude. Ephesians 5:20 encourages us to "...always give thanks to God the Father for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." Starting the day with thankful hearts helps us align our hearts with God's purpose for us.

Having done that, we can then go on to tell our Father about any worries and fears we may have about what is ahead of us. By making prayer our top priority, we are entrusting our day into God's care. When we place our lives into His hands, He strengthens and directs our paths.

Another wonderful early morning habit to develop is spending a little time reading the Scriptures. God communicates with us through His Word and even 10 or 15 minutes reading and meditating on a Bible passage can have a profound influence on our day. Psalm 119:105 reminds us that "Your word is a lamp for my feet; a light on my path." Without that light we risk stumbling into darkness. However, when we meditate on His Word we are constantly reminded of His promises, His love and the plans He has for us.

Each morning we should take a moment to dedicate our entire day to the Lord. This simple pledge will set the tone for everything we encounter. By committing our plans and activities to our Heavenly Father we invite His guidance into every decision we make. It not only enriches our spirit but fosters a deeper connection with Him as well. All we have to say is: 'Father this day is Yours. Let Your will be done in everything I do.' These simple words declare our trust in God and invite Him into every moment and every challenge of our day.

The Prayer Fellowship meets each Wednesday evening in the Pentecost Room at 7.30pm just for an hour to sing God's praise, hear His Word and talk to Him about all our hopes, worries and plans. Silent prayer is absolutely fine! If you are free, we would be delighted to see you.


Bowling Club

Update On Minor Hall



At the Select Vestry meeting in September, approval was given for the repair works to begin in the Minor Hall. To remind you, water has been seeping in through the wall which has caused a considerable amount of damp, which if not addressed would continue to seep further into the church building. We are now at the stage where work can commence to rectify this problem and, at the same time, make the Minor Hall a space suitable for use for both parish and non-parochial groups.

The total cost of the works will be around £50,000, of which £15,000 will come directly from legacies and church funds and £35,000 from a bank loan to be repaid over a period of five years. It is important to say that the Vestry is confident of meeting these costs with no effect on the day-to-day running of the Parish. However, we do hope to organise a few social events to raise some funds and the Church will be appreciative of any donations or contributions made.

Work is due to start very soon and should not affect the Parish Centre. We will, however, expect some minor inconvenience around the rear of the building (both inside and outside) and we apologise for this. When the works are completed, we hope to see a new, large and comfortable room which will be used in conjunction with the rest of our facilities as we continue to invest and develop our Parish.



Freewill Offering and Building / Maintenance Fund Envelopes for 2025



Freewill Offering and Building / Maintenance Fund Envelopes for 2025 will be available at Sunday services from the Parish Centre during December 2024. You are kindly requested to collect your envelopes, and those of any parishioners who live close to you, as quickly as possible and so reduce the large volume of envelopes which are delivered by hand each year.

Within any Parish the regular giving is usually one of the following:

1. Loose Collections

This is money that is put on the plate at each church service and is very much dependent upon attendance.

2. Freewill Offering Envelopes

This has, traditionally, been the most popular means of presenting our offering. Every year a set of envelopes is supplied for each week of that particular year. We place our offering into the envelope and put it onto the plate when we are at Church. Some people adopt the regular practice of filling a weekly envelope and even if they are unable to attend Church, they donate the filled envelopes upon their next visit to Church.

3. Standing Orders

Increasing numbers of parishioners are now using a Standing Order. This method of payment is particularly beneficial to the Parish in that it allows us to budget more efficiently when we know how much income we will have in any given month. We would encourage as many parishioners as possible to use this method for your Church offering. A Standing Order is very easy to set up. You simply decide how much you want to subscribe on a monthly basis and request a form from Ken Jackson, our Parish Recorder. The completed form is then submitted to your bank/building society. Alternatively, you can set this up yourself if you bank online.

If you are a tax payer, you can register to Gift Aid your contributions to the Church. This means that we can claim an extra 25% from HMRC on an annual basis. For further details please speak to Ken Jackson.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank parishioners for their generosity and ongoing support of Mossley Parish.



Antrim & Newtownabbey Street Pastors



It doesn't seem as if two months have passed since I last put pen to paper for the article from Street Pastors for this magazine. We are moving into the darker nights and more challenging weather for our monthly outings on the streets of Newtownabbey.

Last month I mentioned the difficulties that are being experienced, not just by Street Pastors but many other

organisations, since COVID. For example, there is the difficulty in finding recruits. However, I am pleased to announce that we have found three recruits and they are undergoing the necessary training sessions. One of them has even been out on the streets already!

Earlier this month I was out on a cold and dampish night and there were few people about. We called into one of the supermarkets where the staff often speak to us about young people being boisterous in the shop. The staff are always delighted to see us as we engage with those young people and seek to build positive relationships. Over the years I have found that the young people are, more often than not, only too happy to engage with us. We seek to encourage the young people and suggest positive approaches to behaviour and engagement within the local community.

Later that same evening, we chatted with a member of staff in another business. She is always happy to see us and she is willing to engage in meaningful conversation. We also called in with a Young Persons Resource in the centre of Newtownabbey. This is very like a Youth Club. The young people go with their friends and play pool, chess/draughts, and watch movies. Places are limited at this club and poor behaviour is not accepted by the leaders. Newtownabbey could do with more places like this! They are organised by paid staff, some of whom are not much older than the young people they look after. They undertake training for their youth leader roles.

Have you ever thought about coming out for an evening as an observer? You don't have to stay all night. Even an hour would give you a more complete insight.

On Saturday 9th November 2024 our founder, Rev Les Isaac, is coming over for an All-Ireland gathering of Street Pastors. This will be held in Glengormley Methodist Church and starts at 9.30am, running until 3.30pm. Free tea and coffee will be available and a light lunch of soup and sandwiches will also be provided. There is no charge for this event. We simply ask that if you would like to attend, please let us know in advance for catering purposes. During this event there will be reflections on what we, as Street Pastors, do and how we engage in our mission and ministry. At present there are Street Pastor teams in Antrim and Newtownabbey, Belfast, Ards and North Down, Coleraine, Dundonald and Lisburn, Dublin and Cork.

Thank you once again for supporting Street Pastors and allowing me the pleasure of going out on the streets of our Borough as a Christian, representing our Lord and sharing with others the love of Christ our Saviour.

Mossley Mission Group
