# From the Rectory Study

Here we are at the beginning of yet another New Year. I hope you all had a lovely Christmas and I wish you God's richest blessings for 2023.

A couple of days ago I was in a shop and, much to my dismay, there was a row of Easter eggs. I found myself embracing the vocabulary of the famous fictional character Victor Meldrew, from the popular 1990s BBC series *One Foot In The Grave*. The phrase "I don't believe it" would have accurately reflected my feelings! Christmas Day and Boxing Day were just about over for another year and our attention was being drawn towards Easter. Although Easter Sunday is a little earlier this year (9<sup>th</sup> April), there are still three months before we turn our attention to Easter. During this time, we have much to look forward to. For example, we have the return of the Bible Week in later January (details of which are included on page six) and we will be embarking on our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday, 22<sup>nd</sup> February.

Despite my initial reaction, my encounter with the chocolate eggs also challenged me to think a little more profoundly. Their very presence in the shop caused me to reflect on Easter, a season which is the very definition of hope. Perhaps January is the month when we all need a little encouragement, a reminder that there is always hope.

Recently I read an article about the 'January Blues.' It began by saying that, for many people, January is a depressing month. After the excitement and busyness of Christmas, January brings with it cold and dark mornings, personal struggles with New Year Resolutions, and increased financial pressures. The third Monday of January is often referred to as Blue Monday.



The article that I read offered seven tips to beat the January Blues. They included eating properly, getting enough sleep, and enjoying as much daylight as possible. But I felt that an eighth tip should be added to this list! It's a Christian declaration, the reality that Easter is coming and all of us can experience lasting hope by trusting God and spending more time with Him. This declaration simply, yet powerfully, reminds us that no matter what is going on in our lives, God is always greater. It is this assurance that led the Apostle Paul to famously declare, "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?' The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." (1st Corinthians 15:55-57).

We can journey through 2023 with confidence because of Easter hope, the victory that was achieved for all of us by Jesus. Let us embrace this hope and may it strengthen and sustain each of us as we face the joys and challenges that await us in this new year.



## **Online Services**





# **Mossley Prayer Fellowship**

During the COVID pandemic, the results of several Christian surveys indicated that prayer had become a regular practice for increased numbers of people. During the initial period of lockdown in 2020, Google reported a dramatic increase in the number of people searching for prayers. In fact, in March 2020 the share of Google searches for prayer reached the highest level ever recorded! This indicates that people were thinking about, or engaging in, prayer during lockdown.

Almost three years later I can't help but wonder, has this hunger for prayer continued? Does prayer remain an integral part of our daily lives?

Prayer is a wonderful blessing for each of us. It is an opportunity to be still, to step back from the busyness and the stresses of everyday life and spend time with God. There is a famous quote which says, "Time spent alone with God is never wasted." Millions of men, women, and children, all over the world, would agree with this and they believe that prayer brings them peace, comfort, and hope.



The opportunity to pray to God is an awesome privilege. The Bible teaches us that He loves us and cares deeply for us. He knows us by name and is aware of what our troubles and stresses are. He longs to help us through our difficult times and journey with us when life is brighter. God is always there for us and we can develop a

meaningful relationship with Him. Someone once said, "It is an undeniable fact that the closer you draw your heart to God, the closer he draws to you."

As a church family, we have the opportunity to pray together every week. The Prayer Fellowship meets each Wednesday evening at 7.30pm in the Pentecost Room for about an hour, to sing praises to God, read and reflect on His Mighty Word and spend time in spoken and silent prayer. A meeting of the Select Vestry will be held on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> February 2023 at 7.30 pm. Just before this meeting, at 7.15pm, the annual *Revision of the Register of Vestrypersons* will take place. At this meeting all necessary changes to the Register will be made – including adding on any new names!

Any resident or accustomed member of the congregation, who is eighteen years of age and over, may have his/her name added to the Register if he/she fulfils the following requirements.

- Signs a declaration form that he/she is a member of The Church of Ireland.
- Is either a resident parishioner or an accustomed member of the congregation.
- Contributes financially to Mossley Parish.

Declaration forms will be available from Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> January until Monday 20<sup>th</sup> February 2023. Only those parishioners who are registered can vote or stand for election at our Easter General Vestry (Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> April 2023). Please ask the Rector or churchwardens if you would like to register.

# **Badminton Club**





#### **Dove Tots**





# **World Day of Prayer 2023**

(A women led, global, ecumenical movement)

#### "I HAVE HEARD ABOUT YOUR FAITH."



World Day of Prayer is a global ecumenical movement led by Christian women who welcome you to join in prayer and action for peace and justice. In March every year, women in over 170 countries join together in a common Day of Prayer. Throughout the year, we come closer in fellowship, understanding and action.

This year, women from Taiwan have prepared the service and they will be sharing details relating to the geographical, political and social issues that they experience. # **Mossley Mission Group**

In the last edition of this magazine, we announced our intention to provide food hampers to families who are finding life difficult during the ongoing cost of living crisis. We worked alongside Mossley and Earlview Primary Schools with the intention of distributing hampers just before Christmas.



From Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> November the response to this appeal was simply overwhelming. Each week bags of groceries were left in the church porch and generous donations were given to buy further items. In only a few weeks we had tables full of groceries and these were made into hampers on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> December. On the morning of Friday 16<sup>th</sup> December, we had 59 complete hampers and these were distributed to the families who needed them. Thank you so much for your incredible generosity and thanks are also due to the team of parishioners who came along to build the hampers.

Just two days before Christmas the Rector received a

message which offered sincere thanks to the parishioners of Mossley for "...your incredible generosity towards the people of our community. You have brought light and hope at a dark time."

The work of the Mission Group continues, and on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> February we will be hosting a soup and cheese lunch after the 11am service. We are looking for eager volunteers who could help us at this event. Please speak to the Rector or Rev Louise if you could help out in any way.

We continue to pray for the ongoing mission and ministry of Tansen Hospital. As we enter 2023, we have been asked to pray for the expansion of the maternity ward at Tansen. Very often, expectant mothers who come to give birth at Tansen are sadly turned away because there is no bed, or they have to give birth on a visitor bed or be moved to another ward soon after delivery. Tansen Hospital is currently seeking to provide 18 further beds in the maternity ward. Please pray for the success of this project.

We also continue to pray for the work of the South American Mission Society. As you may have noticed in the weekly Parish Bulletin, there is great political and social unrest in parts of South America at present – particularly Brazil, Peru and Bolivia. The level of economic instability is also increasing rapidly throughout much of South America.

In just a few weeks, on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> February, SAMS Ireland will host their annual 'Friday Night Live.' This event includes various reports about what is happening within the churches and local communities of South America.
