# From the Rectory Study

# **Prayer Fellowship**

Can you recall the story of the Transfiguration when Jesus went up on a mountain to pray and he took Peter, James and John with him? As Jesus was praying, the appearance of his face was altered and his clothing became dazzling white. Peter, James and John witnessed this, as well as Jesus talking with Moses and Elijah. The Gospel writers (Matthew, Mark and Luke) record what Peter said to Jesus: 'Lord, it is good that we are here.'

If this was our experience at a prayer retreat, how would we feel? What would be the condition of our hearts? I wonder how Peter, James and John felt when Jesus gave them that exact invitation. Peter's response was a desire to make three tents (one for Jesus, Moses and Elijah) as he wanted to remain there. Peter didn't want the short retreat to end, and that is the fruit of true fellowship with the Lord and His people - especially in the sacred practice of prayer. It is good to be with the Lord.



If we are not regularly seeking the Lord in prayer with other believers, we need to ask ourselves two serious questions and be honest in answering them. If we aren't gathering with other believers to seek God and encourage one another, why not? If we are not praying for our family, friends, congregation and community with one another, why not?

We may offer many reasons and each of them are excuses. We may say, "I don't have the time." That excuse is easily dismissed. No one was busier than Jesus, yet he made and took time to have fellowship in prayer with his disciples. Another flawed reason is the times in which we live and the challenges of isolation because of modern technology. During COVID-19 the Prayer Fellowship continued to meet online through Zoom prayer meetings and no-one had to leave their living room to join in!

Whatever our reasons for not gathering together to pray, all of them are but excuses. Can we imagine the reaction of Jesus if Peter, James and John had said, "Thanks, Jesus, but we don't really want to spend time with you and each other in prayer. We have other things that are more important to us?"

Prayer is a matter of desire turned discipline. It is also a matter of obedience. We are commanded to pray – alone and with other believers. So, don't let anything keep us from saying, "Lord, it is good that we are here" and to receive the many blessings of fellowship that He wishes to bestow upon us.

If you would like to participate in prayer with others from the Parish, we would love you to come along on Wednesday evenings from 7.30pm to 8.30pm and meet in the Pentecost Room. Let us affirm what Peter said to Jesus: "Lord, it is good that we are here."

Pitch your demands heaven-high and they'll be met Ask for the Morning Star and take (thrown in) Your earthly love. Why, yes; but how to set One's foot on the first rung, how to begin?

It challenges and encourages us all, whether leaders or church members, to face the issues and problems confronting our churches today. It offers us timeless principles and insights to be followed, if we are to see many of our churches rise from potential ruin to God-inspired restoration." Our studies of Nehemiah will certainly be timely and relevant.


The study programme will be made available on our website and Facebook page in early September. Paper copies will also be available in the church porch.



# **Antrim & Newtownabbey Street Pastors**



Antrim and Newtownabbey Street Pastors continue to go out on Friday and Saturday nights. At the moment we are on a recruitment drive and training will be starting very soon for any new recruits that we can muster. At the moment, due to numbers, we are reduced to doing no more than ten nights per month and we are going out with three people in a patrol. This is because our insurance only allows us the minimum of three. Not every Street Pastor is available on a monthly basis and it can be difficult to provide teams for Antrim, Ballyclare and Glengormley.

In recent editions of this magazine, I have explained how and why I enjoy going out into the local community and helping in practical ways. It is a blessing to help some people get home safely and offer a listening ear to others. Many people are appreciative of the advice and care that we offer. Such care is a reflection of God's love, a depth and quality of love that passes all understanding and is unconditional.

Personally, I don't consider myself to be well enough versed as a Christian to provide a 'sermon' on the streets. I simply recall the commands of Jesus to go into the world and preach the Gospel. One such passage is Matthew 28:19-20 and it says, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. # **Mossley Mission Group**



In the last edition of this magazine, we suggested that we would be holding a table quiz in September. We are in the process of organising this event and further details will be released soon in the weekly Parish Bulletin. Some early plans have also been made for a concert later in the autumn.

We were delighted to welcome Rev Stephen McElhinney to Mossley on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> July and it was good to get an update on the work of SAMS Ireland. Since then, Stephen has been appointed as Vicar of Glenavy Parish and he will be leaving his role as Mission Director of SAMS Ireland at the end of September. Please do pray for Stephen and also pray about the recruitment process for the new Mission Director.

We are pleased to have received the following update from Tansen hospital.

The hospital has been hoping to start an ENT department for many years. We have had a room set aside for this since 2008, which was used when we ran ear camps a couple of times and for staff to give some simple ear treatments in the past. We also advertised for an ENT surgeon from time to time with no result. So, we were happy to be contacted by a newly qualified ENT specialist looking for a place to work, who was willing to join our team. There are many patients in our community who will benefit from this new service.

Our next project is to raise money to buy a CT scanner. We refer many patients to get CT scans each week and the nearest place is 9km away. This can be a long and difficult journey for seriously ill patients and we often subsidise the costs for poorer patients too. We do not get timely reports back and usually patients are called back a few days later to collect their report. This has been in our plan for a few years too and now we feel it is vital that we can provide this service, to support our different specialties.

The two infrastructure projects are progressing, a little more slowly than we had hoped, but the maternity expansion project should be finished in the next month. After finishing touches are completed in the new admin block, the present admin offices can move and renovation work start to make the new post-delivery ward.

The wastewater project is also progressing. The huge septic tank is being built as we write and the Moving Bed Bio Reactor cleaning machine will be dispatched in the next few weeks from India, where it has been made to our specifications. The project is almost complete!

Please continue to pray for our mission partners – Tansen hospital and SAMS Ireland. Thank you so much for you continued support which is always gratefully received. The next meeting of the Mission Group will be on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> September at 7.30pm. Any new members will be made most welcome.
